37 public-use airports in Idaho



\$4.22 million of unmet needs for its parks system

411 bridges (9.2%) are structurally deficient and Idaho spent \$123,059,525 on bridge capital projects in 2013



0.8 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #40 nationally

There are 93 high-hazard potential dams and 97% of Idaho's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



1,623 miles of rail across the state, ranking #37 by mileage nationally

\$961.8 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



51,163 miles of public roads, with 15% in poor condition

154.9 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #23 nationally



\$376 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

6 sites on the National Priorities List



\$301 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Idaho

110 miles of inland waterways, ranking #30 nationally
