

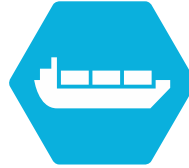

87 public-use airports in Illinois



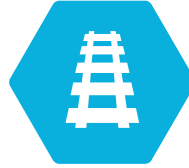
\$669.38 million of unmet needs for its parks system

2,243 bridges (8.4%) are structurally deficient and Illinois spent \$95,436,594 on bridge capital projects in 2013



106.5 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #6 nationally

There are 224 high-hazard potential dams and 87% of Illinois's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



6,986 miles of rail across the state, ranking #2 by mileage nationally

\$6.5 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



145,840 miles of public roads, with 18% in poor condition

308.7 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #8 nationally



\$566 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

45 sites on the National Priorities List



\$862 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Illinois
