

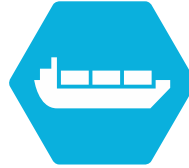
Key Facts About Iowa's Infrastructure

80 public-use airports in Iowa



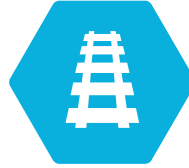
\$249.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

4,968 bridges (20.5%) are structurally deficient and Iowa spent \$633,037,000 on bridge capital projects in 2013



8.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #35 nationally

There are 91 high-hazard potential dams and 23% of Iowa's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



3,869 miles of rail across the state, ranking #11 by mileage nationally

\$890 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



114,442 miles of public roads, with 18% in poor condition

713.6 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #3 nationally



\$499 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the National Priorities List



\$499 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Iowa

490 miles of inland waterways, ranking #18 nationally



28,583,499 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains

659 miles of levees in Iowa in the National Levee Database
