80 public-use airports in Kansas



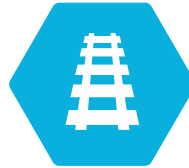
\$523.37 million of unmet needs for its parks system

2,151 bridges (8.6%) are structurally deficient and Kansas spent \$14,925 on bridge capital projects in 2013



0.2 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #42 nationally

There are 235 high-hazard potential dams and 83% of Kansas's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



4,855 miles of rail across the state, ranking #6 by mileage nationally

\$4.2 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



140,654 miles of public roads, with 13% in poor condition

185.1 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #17 nationally



\$500 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the National Priorities List



\$257 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Kansas

120 miles of inland waterways, ranking #29 nationally
