97 public-use airports in Minnesota



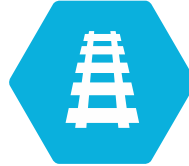
\$128.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

800 bridges (6.0%) are structurally deficient and Minnesota spent \$266,526,103 on bridge capital projects in 2013



43.5 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #17 nationally

There are 25 high-hazard potential dams and 96% of Minnesota's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



4,450 miles of rail across the state, ranking #8 by mileage nationally

\$7.4 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



138,767 miles of public roads, with 15% in poor condition

334.1 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #7 nationally



\$480 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

25 sites on the National Priorities List



\$818 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Minnesota

260 miles of inland waterways, ranking #26 nationally
