71 public-use airports in Montana



\$200 million of unmet needs for its parks system

465 bridges (8.8%) are structurally deficient and Montana spent \$30,141,744 on bridge capital projects in 2013



3,200 miles of rail across the state, ranking #20 by mileage nationally

There are 110 high-hazard potential dams and 87% of Montana's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



75,007 miles of public roads, with 10% in poor condition

\$885.3 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$382 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

133.7 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #27 nationally



\$191 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Montana
