24 public-use airports in New Jersey



\$301.57 million of unmet needs for its parks system

609 bridges (9.0%) are structurally deficient and New Jersey spent \$355,575,439 on bridge capital projects in 2013



147.2 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #4 nationally

There are 221 high-hazard potential dams and 99% of New Jersey's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



981 miles of rail across the state, ranking #41 by mileage nationally

\$933 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



39,065 miles of public roads, with 38% in poor condition

58.9 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #37 nationally



\$667 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

114 sites on the National Priorities List
