57 public-use airports in Oregon



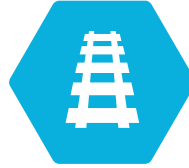
\$5.31 million of unmet needs for its parks system

429 bridges (5.3%) are structurally deficient and Oregon spent \$216,814,592 on bridge capital projects in 2013



32.1 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #25 nationally

There are 77 high-hazard potential dams and 70% of Oregon's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



2,396 miles of rail across the state, ranking #30 by mileage nationally

\$5.6 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



73,544 miles of public roads, with 11% in poor condition

479.0 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #5 nationally



\$285 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

13 sites on the National Priorities List



\$457 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Oregon

680 miles of inland waterways, ranking #15 nationally
