69 public-use airports in Tennessee



\$1.5 billion of unmet needs for its parks system

998 bridges (5.0%) are structurally deficient and Tennessee spent \$130,081,000 on bridge capital projects in 2013



34.8 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #23 nationally

There are 149 high-hazard potential dams and 100% of Tennessee's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



2,649 miles of rail across the state, ranking #27 by mileage nationally

\$2.7 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



95,637 miles of public roads, with 8% in poor condition

180.5 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #19 nationally



\$271 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

17 sites on the National Priorities List



\$768 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Tennessee

950 miles of inland waterways, ranking #11 nationally



32,738,961 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains
