210 public-use airports in Texas



\$86.71 million of unmet needs for its parks system

900 bridges (1.7%) are structurally deficient and Texas spent \$519,012,400 on bridge capital projects in 2013



506.6 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #2 nationally

There are 1,212 high-hazard potential dams and 81% of Texas's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



10,469 miles of rail across the state, ranking #1 by mileage nationally

\$33.9 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



313,596 miles of public roads, with 18% in poor condition

526.9 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #4 nationally



\$506 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

52 sites on the National Priorities List
