13 public-use airports in Connecticut



\$87 million of unmet needs for its parks system

338 bridges (**8.0%**) are structurally deficient and Connecticut spent **\$280,165,324** on bridge capital projects in 2013



13.3 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it **#32** nationally

There are **273** high-hazard potential dams and **86%** of Connecticut's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



364 miles of rail across the state, ranking **#46** by mileage nationally

\$3.6 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



21,512 miles of public roads, with **57%** in poor condition

31.6 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking **#45** nationally



\$864 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

14 sites on the National Priorities List
