55 public-use airports in Kentucky



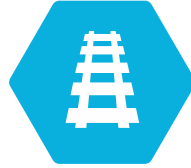
\$9 million of unmet needs for its parks system

1,157 bridges (8.1%) are structurally deficient and Kentucky spent \$286,506,101 on bridge capital projects in 2013



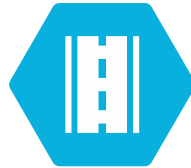
101.1 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #7 nationally

There are 182 high-hazard potential dams and 76% of Kentucky's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



2,608 miles of rail across the state, ranking #28 by mileage nationally

\$6.2 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



79,857 miles of public roads, with 8% in poor condition

75.3 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #34 nationally



\$331 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair
