59 public-use airports in Arizona





\$162.7 million of unmet needs for its parks system

214 bridges (2.6%) are structurally deficient and Arizona spent \$49,318,852 on bridge capital projects in 2013





1,643 miles of rail across the state, ranking **#36** by mileage nationally

There are 108 high-hazard potential dams and 93% of Arizona's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan





66,122 miles of public roads, with **15%** in poor condition

\$6.1 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years
