99 public-use airports in Georgia



\$123 million of unmet needs for its parks system

700 bridges (4.7%) are structurally deficient and Georgia spent \$147,020,030 on bridge capital projects in 2013



37.6 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #22 nationally

There are 472 high-hazard potential dams and 11% of Georgia's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



4,653 miles of rail across the state, ranking #7 by mileage nationally

\$9.3 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



128,134 miles of public roads, with 4% in poor condition

257.3 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #10 nationally



\$196 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

16 sites on the National Priorities List



168,330,253 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains

720 miles of inland waterways, ranking #14 nationally
