15 public-use airports in Hawaii



\$2 million of unmet needs for its parks system

64 bridges (5.7%) are structurally deficient and Hawaii spent \$22,517,293 on bridge capital projects in 2013



24.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #26 nationally

There are 123 high-hazard potential dams and 98% of Hawaii's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



4,455 miles of public roads, with 39% in poor condition

\$1.05 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$708 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

27.2 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #46 nationally



\$88 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Hawaii
