

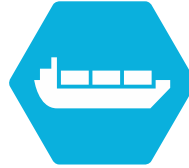
Key Facts About Maine's Infrastructure

35 public-use airports in Maine



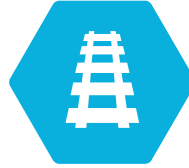
\$34.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

352 bridges (14.4%) are structurally deficient and Maine spent \$3,164,931 on bridge capital projects in 2013



12 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #33 nationally

There are 30 high-hazard potential dams and 100% of Maine's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



1,116 miles of rail across the state, ranking #40 by mileage nationally

\$7.7 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



22,911 miles of public roads, with 21% in poor condition

151.3 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #24 nationally



\$460 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

13 sites on the National Priorities List



\$304 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Maine

70 miles of inland waterways, ranking #34 nationally



6,623,035 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains

2 miles of levees in Maine in the National Levee Database
