28 public-use airports in Massachusetts



\$17.23 million of unmet needs for its parks system

483 bridges (**9.3%**) are structurally deficient and Massachusetts spent **\$503,058,791** on bridge capital projects in 2013



18.7 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it **#29** nationally

There are **292** high-hazard potential dams and **98%** of Massachusetts's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



973 miles of rail across the state, ranking **#42** by mileage nationally

\$1.2 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



36,423 miles of public roads, with **16%** in poor condition

64.3 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking **#36** nationally



\$539 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

32 sites on the National Priorities List



\$1.4 billion gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Massachusetts
