73 public-use airports in Nebraska



\$98.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

2,361 bridges (15.4%) are structurally deficient and Nebraska spent \$61,770,808 on bridge capital projects in 2013



3,375 miles of rail across the state, ranking #15 by mileage nationally

There are 141 high-hazard potential dams and 96% of Nebraska's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



94,481 miles of public roads, with 10% in poor condition

\$1.6 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$348 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

277.9 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #9 nationally



\$292 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Nebraska

16 sites on the National Priorities List
