

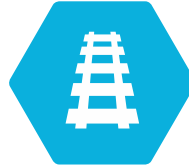
## Key Facts About New Mexico's Infrastructure

51 public-use airports in New Mexico



\$239.4 million of unmet needs for its parks system

258 bridges (6.5%) are structurally deficient and New Mexico spent \$43,632,686 on bridge capital projects in 2013



1,837 miles of rail across the state, ranking #34 by mileage nationally

There are 167 high-hazard potential dams and 30% of New Mexico's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



69,069 miles of public roads, with 26% in poor condition

\$1.16 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$594 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

42.2 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #43 nationally



\$407 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in New Mexico

16 sites on the National Priorities List



17,540,050 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains
