89 public-use airports in New York



\$239.4 million of unmet needs for its parks system

1,928 bridges (11.0%) are structurally deficient and New York spent \$1,137,009,628 on bridge capital projects in 2013



38.4 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #21 nationally

There are 404 high-hazard potential dams and 97% of New York's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



3,447 miles of rail across the state, ranking #14 by mileage nationally

\$407 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



114,365 miles of public roads, with 28% in poor condition

398.8 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #6 nationally



\$571 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

85 sites on the National Priorities List



\$2.9 billion gap in estimated school capital expenditures in New York

390 miles of inland waterways, ranking #21 nationally
