101 public-use airports in Oklahoma



\$4.58 million of unmet needs for its parks system

3,460 bridges (15.0%) are structurally deficient and Oklahoma spent \$341,081,793 on bridge capital projects in 2013



6.2 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #37 nationally

There are 359 high-hazard potential dams and 94% of Oklahoma's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



3,273 miles of rail across the state, ranking #17 by mileage nationally

\$6.5 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



112,711 miles of public roads, with 26% in poor condition

155.9 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #21 nationally



\$718 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

7 sites on the National Priorities List
