23 public-use airports in West Virginia



\$44.2 million of unmet needs for its parks system

1,247 bridges (**17.3%**) are structurally deficient and West Virginia spent **\$154,877,362** on bridge capital projects in 2013



63.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it **#14** nationally

There are **285** high-hazard potential dams and **94%** of West Virginia's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



2,226 miles of rail across the state, ranking **#32** by mileage nationally

\$1.16 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



38,770 miles of public roads, with **19%** in poor condition

49.5 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking **#42** nationally



\$515 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

10 sites on the National Priorities List



\$265 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in West Virginia

680 miles of inland waterways, ranking **#15** nationally
