87 public-use airports in Wisconsin



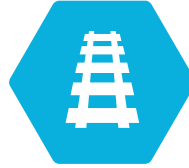
\$15 million of unmet needs for its parks system

1,232 bridges (8.7%) are structurally deficient and Wisconsin spent \$289,075,761 on bridge capital projects in 2013



33.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #24 nationally

There are 157 high-hazard potential dams and 76% of Wisconsin's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



3,449 miles of rail across the state, ranking #13 by mileage nationally

\$1 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



115,372 miles of public roads, with 27% in poor condition

199.8 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #15 nationally
