

Key Facts About Wyoming's Infrastructure

33 public-use airports in Wyoming



\$0.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

344 bridges (11.0%) are structurally deficient and Wyoming spent \$13,197,824 on bridge capital projects in 2013



1,860 miles of rail across the state, ranking #33 by mileage nationally

There are 87 high-hazard potential dams and 89% of Wyoming's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



28,942 miles of public roads, with 9% in poor condition

\$409.9 million in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$341 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

54.0 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #40 nationally



\$149 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Wyoming
