95 public-use airports in Michigan



\$370 million of unmet needs for its parks system

1,234 bridges (11.1%) are structurally deficient and Michigan spent \$261,565,021 on bridge capital projects in 2013



60 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #15 nationally

There are 88 high-hazard potential dams and 95% of Michigan's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



3,542 miles of rail across the state, ranking #12 by mileage nationally

\$13.8 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



122,286 miles of public roads, with 21% in poor condition

193.4 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #16 nationally



\$540 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

65 sites on the National Priorities List
