73 public-use airports in Mississippi



\$90 million of unmet needs for its parks system

3,195 bridges (13.1%) are structurally deficient and Mississippi spent \$86,150,790 on bridge capital projects in 2013



45.5 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #16 nationally

There are 305 high-hazard potential dams and 83% of Mississippi's regulated dams have an Emergency Action Plan



2,452 miles of rail across the state, ranking #29 by mileage nationally

\$8.5 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



76,777 miles of public roads, with 28% in poor condition

58.6 trillion British thermal units of renewable energy produced, ranking #38 nationally



\$705 per motorist per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

8 sites on the National Priorities List



\$289 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Mississippi

870 miles of inland waterways, ranking #12 nationally
