



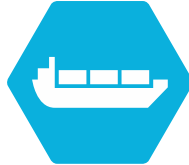
Key Facts About Alabama's Infrastructure

74 public-use airports in Alabama



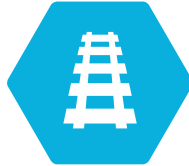
\$75.79 million of unmet needs for its parks system

16,129 bridges, 7.4% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



81.7 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #10 nationally

There are 2,273 dams in Alabama, 226 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 16% have an Emergency Action Plan



3,272 miles of rail across the state, ranking #15 by mileage nationally

\$11.26 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



101,097 miles of public roads, with 14% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$507 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$299 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Alabama

1,270 of inland waterways, ranking #6 nationally



7,827,744 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

16 miles of levees in Alabama in the National Levee Database



\$3.1 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
