



Key Facts About Arizona's Infrastructure

59 public-use airports in Arizona



\$162.7 million of unmet needs for its parks system

8,289 bridges, 2.5% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



1,820 miles of rail across the state, ranking #36 by mileage nationally

There are 376 dams in Arizona, 164 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 91% have an Emergency Action Plan



66,558 miles of public roads, with 20% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$577 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

\$9.13 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$350 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Arizona

9 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



95,412,935 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

901 miles of levees in Arizona in the National Levee Database



\$6.77 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
