



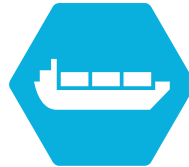
Key Facts About Arkansas' Infrastructure

76 public-use airports in Arkansas



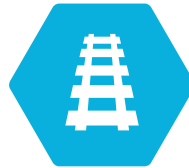
\$231.72 million of unmet needs for its parks system

12,864 bridges, 5.9% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



18.2 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #30 nationally

There are 1,263 dams in Arkansas, 193 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 70% have an Emergency Action Plan



2,505 miles of rail across the state, ranking #26 by mileage nationally

\$7.38 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



102,603 miles of public roads, with 17% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$543 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

9 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$587 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Arkansas

1,860 of inland waterways, ranking #3 nationally



6,183,297 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

1,458 miles of levees in Arkansas in the National Levee Database



\$715 million in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
