



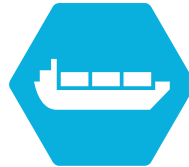
Key Facts About California's Infrastructure

190 public-use airports in California



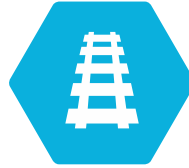
\$4.85 billion of unmet needs for its parks system

25,657 bridges, 6.2% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



230.2 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #3 nationally

There are 1,580 dams in California, 805 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 74% have an Emergency Action Plan



4,828 miles of rail across the state, ranking #5 by mileage nationally

\$51 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



176,214 miles of public roads, with 45% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$862 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

98 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$3.2 billion gap in estimated school capital expenditures in California

290 of inland waterways, ranking #25 nationally



1,324,436,440 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

9,560 miles of levees in California in the National Levee Database



\$26.2 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
