



Key Facts About Colorado's Infrastructure

49 public-use airports in Colorado



\$625 million of unmet needs for its parks system

8,717 bridges, 5.6% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



2,427 miles of rail across the state, ranking #28 by mileage nationally

There are 1,803 dams in Colorado, 453 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 98% have an Emergency Action Plan



88,818 miles of public roads, with 22% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$637 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

\$10.19 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$640 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Colorado

20 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



125,463,344 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

66 miles of levees in Colorado in the National Levee Database



\$4.69 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
