



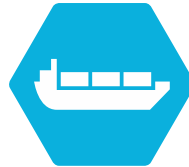
Key Facts About Idaho's Infrastructure

37 public-use airports in Idaho



\$4.22 million of unmet needs for its parks system

4,492 bridges, 8.7% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



0.8 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #40 nationally

There are 472 dams in Idaho, 101 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 99% have an Emergency Action Plan



1,729 miles of rail across the state, ranking #37 by mileage nationally

\$1.3 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



52,437 miles of public roads, with 15% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$427 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

6 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$301 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Idaho

110 of inland waterways, ranking #30 nationally



3,533,885 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

234 miles of levees in Idaho in the National Levee Database



\$1.38 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
