



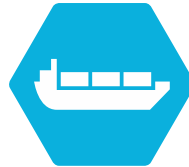
Key Facts About Illinois' Infrastructure

86 public-use airports in Illinois



\$669.38 million of unmet needs for its parks system

26,775 bridges, 8.6% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



106.5 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #6 nationally

There are 1,662 dams in Illinois, 253 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 78% have an Emergency Action Plan



7,151 miles of rail across the state, ranking #2 by mileage nationally

\$20.91 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



145,936 miles of public roads, with 19% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$586 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

45 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$862 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Illinois

1,100 of inland waterways, ranking #8 nationally



620,035,477 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

1,701 miles of levees in Illinois in the National Levee Database



\$6.53 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
