



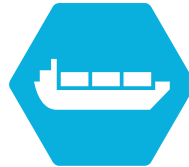
Key Facts About Iowa's Infrastructure

80 public-use airports in Iowa



\$249.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

24,215 bridges, 20.9% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



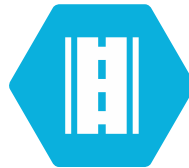
8.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #35 nationally

There are 4,018 dams in Iowa, 99 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 35% have an Emergency Action Plan



3,834 miles of rail across the state, ranking #10 by mileage nationally

\$7.85 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



114,637 miles of public roads, with 9% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$362 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$499 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Iowa

490 of inland waterways, ranking #18 nationally



25,752,459 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

659 miles of levees in Iowa in the National Levee Database



\$2.48 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
