



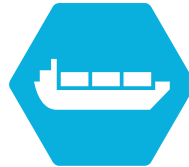
Key Facts About Kansas' Infrastructure

80 public-use airports in Kansas



\$523.37 million of unmet needs for its parks system

25,001 bridges, 8.5% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



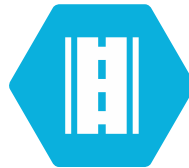
0.2 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #42 nationally

There are 6,403 dams in Kansas, 289 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 94% have an Emergency Action Plan



4,675 miles of rail across the state, ranking #6 by mileage nationally

\$5.32 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



142,054 miles of public roads, with 14% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$592 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$257 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Kansas

120 of inland waterways, ranking #29 nationally



8,507,019 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

601 miles of levees in Kansas in the National Levee Database



\$3.76 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
