



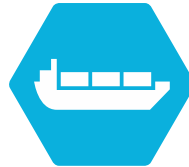
Key Facts About Maine's Infrastructure

35 public-use airports in Maine



\$34.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

2,458 bridges, 13.3% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



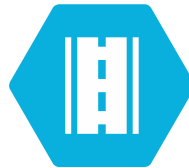
12 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #33 nationally

There are 584 dams in Maine, 66 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 67% have an Emergency Action Plan



1,077 miles of rail across the state, ranking #40 by mileage nationally

\$1.35 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



22,860 miles of public roads, with 22% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$529 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$304 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Maine

70 of inland waterways, ranking #34 nationally



7,127,306 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

2 miles of levees in Maine in the National Levee Database



\$970 million in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
