



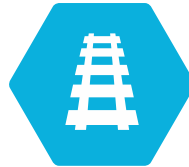
Key Facts About Nebraska's Infrastructure

73 public-use airports in Nebraska



\$98.5 million of unmet needs for its parks system

15,330 bridges, 14.7% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



3,117 miles of rail across the state, ranking #20 by mileage nationally

There are 3,007 dams in Nebraska, 149 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 98% have an Emergency Action Plan



95,163 miles of public roads, with 10% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$467 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

\$1.64 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$292 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Nebraska

17 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



6,863,048 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

320 of inland waterways, ranking #24 nationally



\$2.56 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years

419 miles of levees in Nebraska in the National Levee Database
