



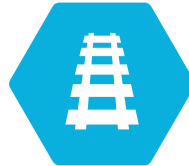
Key Facts About New Mexico's Infrastructure

50 public-use airports in New Mexico



\$239.4 million of unmet needs for its parks system

3,999 bridges, 6.3% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



1,879 miles of rail across the state, ranking #35 by mileage nationally

There are 407 dams in New Mexico, 219 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 52% have an Emergency Action Plan



77,205 miles of public roads, with 31% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$769 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

\$1.36 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$407 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in New Mexico

16 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



14,799,888 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

512 miles of levees in New Mexico in the National Levee Database



\$320 million in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
