



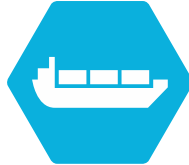
Key Facts About New York's Infrastructure

83 public-use airports in New York



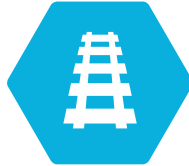
\$239.4 million of unmet needs for its parks system

17,456 bridges, 10.5% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



38.4 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #21 nationally

There are 1,934 dams in New York, 424 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 98% have an Emergency Action Plan



3,279 miles of rail across the state, ranking #14 by mileage nationally

\$22.76 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



113,559 miles of public roads, with 20% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$509 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

85 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$2.9 billion gap in estimated school capital expenditures in New York

390 of inland waterways, ranking #21 nationally



3,938,103,542 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

121 miles of levees in New York in the National Levee Database
