



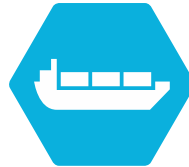
Key Facts About Rhode Island's Infrastructure

6 public-use airports in Rhode Island



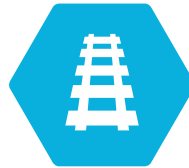
\$4.72 million of unmet needs for its parks system

0,778 bridges, 23.3% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



8.8 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #36 nationally

There are 234 dams in Rhode Island, 96 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 26% have an Emergency Action Plan



58 miles of rail across the state, ranking #49 by mileage nationally

\$3.7 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



6,027 miles of public roads, with 53% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$823 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

12 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$241 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Rhode Island

40 of inland waterways, ranking #35 nationally



16,645,751 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

4 miles of levees in Rhode Island in the National Levee Database



\$1.92 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
