



Key Facts About Utah's Infrastructure

36 public-use airports in Utah



\$376 million of unmet needs for its parks system

3,051 bridges, 2.9% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



1,386 miles of rail across the state, ranking #38 by mileage nationally

There are 860 dams in Utah, 266 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 99% have an Emergency Action Plan



49,290 miles of public roads, with 22% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$694 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

\$45.15 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$496 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Utah

13 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



49,234,433 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

73 miles of levees in Utah in the National Levee Database



\$842 million in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
