



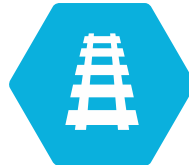
Key Facts About Vermont's Infrastructure

12 public-use airports in Vermont



\$10 million of unmet needs for its parks system

2,772 bridges, 5.2% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



578 miles of rail across the state, ranking #44 by mileage nationally

There are 368 dams in Vermont, 61 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 82% have an Emergency Action Plan



14,255 miles of public roads, with 17% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$419 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

\$4.35 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



\$198 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Vermont

12 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



5,562,899 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

1 mile of levees in Vermont in the National Levee Database



\$154 million in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
