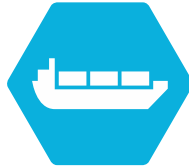




Key Facts About Washington, D.C.'s Infrastructure

245 bridges, 3.3% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



0.1 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #43 nationally

\$11.73 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



22 miles of rail across the state, ranking #50 by mileage nationally

1 site on the Superfund National Priorities List



1,514 miles of public roads, with 93% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$991 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

10 of inland waterways, ranking #36 nationally



357,599,082 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

3 miles of levees in Washington, D.C. in the National Levee Database
