



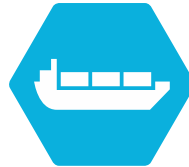
Key Facts About West Virginia's Infrastructure

23 public-use airports in West Virginia



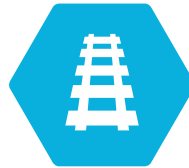
\$44.2 million of unmet needs for its parks system

7,228 bridges, 19% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



63.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #14 nationally

There are 586 dams in West Virginia, 432 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 75% have an Emergency Action Plan



2,214 miles of rail across the state, ranking #32 by mileage nationally

\$1.39 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



38,854 miles of public roads, with 31% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$723 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

9 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$265 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in West Virginia

680 of inland waterways, ranking #15 nationally



7,944,282 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

37 miles of levees in West Virginia in the National Levee Database



\$3.26 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
