



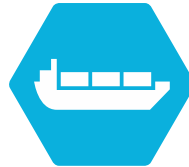
Key Facts About Wisconsin's Infrastructure

87 public-use airports in Wisconsin



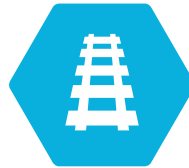
\$15 million of unmet needs for its parks system

14,253 bridges, 8.7% of which were structurally deficient in 2017



33.9 million short tons of cargo in 2014, ranking it #24 nationally

There are 1,065 dams in Wisconsin, 198 of which are high-hazard potential. Of the high-hazard potential dams, 93% have an Emergency Action Plan



3,253 miles of rail across the state, ranking #16 by mileage nationally

\$8.57 billion in drinking water infrastructure needs over 20 years



115,547 miles of public roads, with 29% in poor condition. Each motorist pays \$737 per year in costs from driving on roads in need of repair

36 sites on the Superfund National Priorities List



\$836 million gap in estimated school capital expenditures in Wisconsin

230 of inland waterways, ranking #27 nationally



62,596,518 annual unlinked passenger trips via transit systems including bus, transit, and commuter trains in 2017

50 miles of levees in Wisconsin in the National Levee Database



\$6.33 billion in wastewater infrastructure needs over 20 years
